- Health and social care


After consultation with local residents during November, the Forum will revise this draft local plan and send it to the Hastings Local Strategic Partnership.

# Produced with the Castle Ward Forum

### This is our draft Local Action Plan for Castle Ward

After consultation with local residents and with the service providers it will be revised and finalised. It will then become part of the overall Community Strategy for Hastings & St Leonards.

The Action Plan sets priorities for action over the next 12 to 18 months based on key issues identified by the community.

Several important developments for the area will also be progressed during this period:

- 1 A new University Centre housed in new and refurbished town centre buildings.
- 2 A new Hastings Media Centre in Robertson Street with workspace and support for creative businesses.
- 3 Redevelopment of Hastings Station goods yard for academic, commercial and residential uses as part of the Hastings Millennium Community Project.
- 4 Promotion of the town centre and central seafront as an attractive and vibrant visitor and business destination.

  This will include developing an 'evening economy', encouraging new cultural and heritage projects and improving public spaces.
