
Puzzled by Neighbourhood Planning?


All the discussion sessions will be recorded and summarised using visual minutes that will be on display for you to view and respond to during the break sessions.

A plenary session will give you a birds eye view of the opportunities for communities to help shape great places to live.

Creative and Practical workshops will continue and provide a foundation for further group discussions.

Group discussion will explore the demands of establishing the best sort of local leadership to support neighbourhood planning.
