Architecture Centres

With the establishment of the Commission for Architecture and the Built Environment (CABE) and the Regional Development Agencies (RDAs), an infrastructure is emerging which should begin to support the UK's growing network of architecture centres; centres whose key objective is to involve people in decisions about the design of buildings and the development of their local environment.

This seminar examines existing models of centres for architecture and the built environment in Britain and Europe and aims to provide participants with an opportunity to consider the issues and obstacles which may be encountered in setting up and running such a centre.

The seminar is conducted by staff from The Building Exploratory, currently the only centre in the UK to explore the built environment by means of a hands-on exhibition, and to bring information about the local built environment together under one roof.

Seminar participants will visit the Building Exploratory during the afternoon session. The visit will provide an opportunity to explore how a successful centre was set up and how it operates.

Nicole Crockett is Director of the **Building Exploratory**, Hackney and previously worked for the Architecture Foundation.

Lisa Rigg is Exhibition Curator at **The Building Exploratory**, Hackney.
