Around 10 million homes in Britain currently have access to the Internet and this number is set to increase rapidly as Information Technology becomes more affordable and user-friendly.

Project websites offer a unique opportunity to provide an online one-stop shop for communities engaged in planning projects. Information and opinion can be exchanged and stored on a constant, evolving, interactive medium that builds links between the project team and the community it serves.

This training seminar will provide an overview of the devices and techniques that can be employed through a Website to facilitate successful consultation, as well as look at the features that enable community members to interact.

The seminar will involve presentations as well as a hands-on training session using a User Online website template that will enable participants to create a live, online project consultation scenario.

Ben Derbyshire, Rory Bergin and Colin Ainger from **HTA Architects** Ltd will run the session. HTA are specialists in designing, building and refurbishing housing, combining long experience in project management and masterplanning with expertise in resident consultation.

Ben Derbyshire is Quality Director of HTA Architects. Rory Bergin (Associate Director) and Colin Ainger (Assistant Project Manager) have been instrumental in setting up and managing UserOnline, the web-based consultation toolkit for regeneration projects.
