Enquiry by Design

This seminar focuses on a collaborative and participatory approach to the planning and design of new neighbourhoods on large development sites and in regeneration areas using 'Enquiry by Design'. This process allows a wide range of professionals and lay-people to interact and collaborate in a structured and highly effective way and to rediscover the techniques necessary to create liveable neighbourhoods.

The Enquiry by Design approach differs from many other participatory methods in requiring a high level of technical input from a wide range of professionals including town planners, highway engineers and surveyors. This results in outcomes which are

invariably innovative yet robust. The process is referred to as an example of collaborative working in the Urban White Paper and is also highly relevant to the themes promoted in The Planning Green Paper.

This seminar will draw on The Prince's Foundation's own experiences of piloting the Enquiry by Design approach in a variety of urban situations including town extensions, the redevelopment of large brownfield sites and the physical restructuring of existing local authority estates. It will include a mock Enquiry by Design session focusing on a live project and is aimed at all those in the development field.

Paul Murrain is Director of The Urban Programme at the The Prince's Foundation. He has 25 years' experience in providing expert urban design advice, leading design teams, consultation and academic research projects related to new urban settlements and large-scale residential and mixed use developments, in the UK and abroad.

David Warburton is Director of Development and Regeneration at The Prince's Foundation. Drawing on 15 years experience in the field, David is responsible for the Foundation's area-based development and regeneration projects including joint initiatives with the Regional Development Agencies, English Partnerships, DTLR and other public and private sector bodies.

Lesley Chalmers is an Associate Director of The Prince's Foundation and an independent consultant. Previously she led two of the country's largest and most complex inner-city regeneration initiatives, the Hulme and Moss Side City Challenge project and the King's Cross Partnership in London.
